Earn A Bike Debut

Last spring we launched our Earn A Bike program for children and teens in the Greater Green Bay Area. We held regular hours every Friday just for EAB and hosted kids from the Boys and Girls Club, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Advocates For Healthy Transitions, as well as children from the neighborhood. The program was funded by a combination of a grant we received from the Greater Green Bay Foundation, donations made by BayCare Clinic Foundation, private donors, and our fundraising efforts. We hosted EAB on Fridays all summer and taught them bike safety and maintenance. By the time school started, we had 14 kids earn bikes! This is a really fun program and we look forward to it this year. We will post hours once the quarantine is lifted.
